Rose is everyone and no one, a fake or a real identity; it suggests a dialogue, a conversation, ------a connection that we have just missed.

What happens after an internet artwork is uploaded online? With an overwhelming amount of information constantly being published online there is a sense of ephemerality, in spite of the notion that once something is online it can never truly be erased. Often this can be accompanied by a fear of a loss of relevance, in the constant fight for online mindspace. These artists explore the impact of these juxtaposed freedoms and limitations on the way we relate ourselves to the web, our sexuality, irl and online personas and ultimately the way we portray ourselves to others.

Artist Kimmo Modig was invited to write a commentary which runs between the works.

Hey, wutsup. Hey, wobbly bit of a second. Hey, retinal residue of screen vertigo. Hey, you. I know you in science and in fiction, but otherwise not that well. Hey, rosy glow, white glow, night light. Hey, 20-20-20 to keep up with looking. Hey, I'm around later, so pm me.

#### **Artist Bios**

**Brenna Murphy** weaves trans-dimensional labyrinths using personal recording devices, computer graphics programs and digital fabrication. Her work is an ongoing meditation on the psychedelic composition of embodied experience across physical and virtual realms. She also works collaboratively with Birch Cooper under the collective name MSHR, producing interactive sound installations and ceremonial performances. They are currently artists in residence at Pioneer Works, Brooklyn. Her work is represented by Upfor and American Medium.

Kate Durbin is a Los Angeles based artist and writer. Her recent performances include Hello Selfie, performed with the Pulse Art Fair at Art Basel in collaboration with Transfer gallery, and with Arts Queensland in Brisbane, Australia; The Supreme Gentleman, about Isla Vista Killer Elliot Rodger, performed for the Yes All Women Art benefit in Los Angeles and featured on Art 21's blog; and Cloud 9, an interactive online performance about female artists and money commissioned from New Hive and featured now at the Katherine Nash gallery at the University of Minnesota for the Women and Money Project. Her books include E! Entertainment, The Ravenous Audience, and ABRA, a free iOs app that is an interactive poetry generator and toy. www. katedurbin.la

Leah Beeferman is a New York City-based artist. She has had solo exhibitions at Rawson Projects, NY. Recent two-person and group exhibitions include Klaus von Nichtssagend, NY; Bass & Reiner, San Francisco; Fridman Gallery, NY; Ditch Projects, OR; Interstate Projects, Brooklyn; Tyson, Cologne; and Toves, Copenhagen. Residencies include LMCC Workspace, NY; The Arctic Circle, Svalbard; SIM, Reykjavik; Sirius, Ireland; and Experimental Sound Studio, Chicago. Publications include Triple Point, an artist book published by Lodret Vandret, Copenhagen. Beeferman received an MFA from Virginia Commonwealth University and a BA from Brown University. She will travel to Finland this winter on a Fulbright Scholar Award, during which she will have a solo exhibition at Sorbus, Helsinki. She co-runs Parallelograms, an ongoing artist project.

Morehshin Allahyari is a new media artist, activist, educator, and occasional curator. She was born and raised in Iran and moved to the United States in 2007. Her work extensively deals with the political, social, and cultural contradictions we face every day. She thinks about technology as a philosophical toolset to reflect on objects; a poetic mean to document the personal and collective lives we live and our struggles as humans in the 21st century. Morehshin has been part of numerous exhibitions, festivals, and workshops around the world including Venice Biennale, Museum of Contemporary Art in Montreal, Queens Museum, Pori Museum, Dallas Museum of Art, Museo Ex-Teresa Arte Actual, Contemporary Arts Museum of Houston, Museum für

Angewandte Kunst, Miami Art fair, and Material Art fair. She has been an artist in residence at BANFF Centre (2013), Carnegie Mellon University's STUDIO for Creative Inquiry (2015), Autodesk Pier9 Workshop in San Francisco (2015), and the Vilém Flusser Residency Program for Artistic Research in association with Transmediale, Berlin -in collaboration with writer/artist Daniel Rourke – (2016). Morehshin will be an artist in residence at Eyebeam's one year Research Residency (2016-2017) starting this October.

**Megan Snowe** (b. 1986) works in a variety of mediums including installation, animation, text, drawing and sound. Snowe has recently been driven by the question of how we understand, strategize and quantify our immaterial and emotional lived experiences, critiquing various social strategies and subconscious behaviors that perpetuate inhibiting social norms. With a BA in Russian Studies & Studio Art from Oberlin College (2008) and an MFA in Time & Space Arts from the Finnish Academy of Fine Arts (2014) Snowe has exhibited throughout Europe, the US and online.

Faith Holland is an artist and curator whose practice focuses on gender and sexuality's relationship to technology. She received her BA in Media Studies at Vassar College and her MFA in Photography, Video, and Related Media at the School of Visual Arts. She has exhibited her work at Elga Wimmer (New York), Axiom Gallery (Boston), the Philips Collection (Washington, D.C.), DAM Gallery (Berlin), and File Festival (São Paulo). Her work has appeared in Artforum, The Sunday Times UK, Elephant, Art F City, Hyperallergic, The Creator's Project, and Dazed Digital. She was a 2014 New York Foundation for the Arts Fellowship Finalist in Digital/Electronic Art. In 2015, she had her first solo show at Transfer Gallery in New York. She is currently an artist-in-residence at Jamaica Center for Arts and Learning and Harvestworks. www.faithholland.com

Valentina Fois is an independent curator based in London. She has curated a large number of exhibitions in the UK and abroad, including a digital art commission for Art15 Global Art Fair London, funded by the Arts Council England (ACE). In 2010 she founded La Scatola Gallery, London, to promote emerging artists in the UK. Since 2013 La Scatola Gallery has operated as a curatorial agency and art consultancy. Her areas of interest and expertise include early career artists and new media. Her work and research focus on art and technology within contemporary network culture. Her latest academic research on the subject of "prosumerism" has been published by the Electronic Visualisation and the Arts. Recent projects include: The Other Art Fair, London; The Wrong, New Digital Art Biennale, 2015-2016; At Home Salon: Double Acts, Ascot, HUMANS UNITE, Public Exhibitions, London, The Limited Collection, co-curated with Rozsa Zita Farkas (@ArcadiaMissa).
